Following is a listing of approved plant material including shrubs, ground cover and accent planting to use as a guide for the selection of plants for the front planting beds and general landscaping needs. The plants are compatible with our community's overall character of landscape, most are drought tolerant, and *those marked with an asterisk (*) are native to Florida*. Not included are species which are invasive, or ones with weak root systems or susceptible to wind damage. Homeowners are requested to research available material or consult a professional landscaper prior to a landscape modification.

The planting and removal of annuals (seasonal flowers) is exempt from required ARC-M (N) approval. (See Rule No.18 for Planting Exceptions)

MULCH: Florida Grade ‘A’ **Recommended: Eucalyptus or Pine Straw**
Mulch adds nutrients to the soil, makes a plant bed more attractive, discourages weeds, inhibits soil erosion, and helps conserve moisture in the soil.

DECORATIVE ROCK COVER: Limited use is professionally encouraged. Stone cover does not contribute to the soil’s nutrient value, increases radiant heat therefore possibly damaging the plant, and allows moisture evaporation which produces added watering needs.
