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## 2007 ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

### TREE STANDARDS

These standards are intended as a guide for the replacement/addition of trees within the community of Autumn Woods.

Approved List for:

**1. Streetscape Canopy Tree Continuity: (*Matching species of one or more*)**

Oak (native) Mahogany (native) Shady Lady

**2. Native Tree/retention Areas:** A defined natural landscape feature intended to protect the native trees and vegetation existing on individual lots and common area during development. These shallow depressions of native plants and trees help to give the property a higher standard of Community design. Trees acceptable for these sites are:

Cabbage Palm (native) Dahoon Holly Slash Pine  
Cypress – Pond or Bald Oak species

**3. Flowering/Accent Trees:** Size consideration determines site installation. Height usually not exceeding 25'-30'; for compact areas of plant beds, entryway courtyards, corners of garage, rear yards, extended side yards.

\*Cassia (Desert) \*Geiger (Florida & Texas)  
Cattley Guava Hong Kong Orchid (*Open site*)  
Crape Myrtle \*Magnolia – Sweet Bay, Little Gem ((native))  
\*Dahoon Holly (native) \*Pines (native)  
Frangipani (*Plumeria*) Poinciana Dwarf  
Tababuia -Ipe (*Open site*)

**\*Approved streetscape accent trees**

**4. Tree Durability:**

Collier County requires landscape trees to be Florida #1 grade or better.

**5. Tree Specifications:**

Canopy trees shall be a minimum 10 feet tall in height, 25 gallon or larger, with a 4' canopy spread at time of planting.

**6. Large Specimen Species:**

Trees with a width of 50 feet or more will not be permitted for residential lots. Trees of this scale dominate most residential landscape sites; these include, but are not limited to, the Royal Poinciana Tree and the Jacaranda Tree.

*Specimens on this list may be updated, added to or deleted subject to appropriate current County and/or State recommendation and Board of Directors approval.*

NOTE: The planting of fruit trees, including Coconut Palms, is prohibited in the front or side lawns on a homeowner's property.

To propose an alternative to the approved tree planting list, please submit a landscape plan to the ARC-M with all pertinent information including the name of tree, location of planting and a diagram of surrounding and existing trees in relation to the new planting. Any planting or removal of a tree(s) or palm(s) must have prior written approval of the ARC-M (N).
